What to Bring

Here is a checklist of suggested items for incoming students. Although every student has different needs, we have starred (*) a number of items that we believe are essential. <u>*Please*</u> <u>remember these items are NOT required</u> and many items can be purchased later, once you have had time to settle into your space.

Make sure to check with your roommate/suitemates to avoid purchasing duplicates of agreed upon shared items or appliances. Friends and family who have attended college may also have additional suggestions on what to bring, ask them too!

Generally, each room includes a bed, mattress (size Twin XL), a dresser, a desk and desk chair, and closet space.

Room Comfort

- Curtains and tension rod (there are blinds on all of the windows)

- Additional furnishings (TV stand, bookcase, comfy seating/cushions/beanbags)
- Pictures of families and friends
- Wall decorations (posters, pictures, etc.)
- o Air freshener/diffuser

Meal Preparation

- Small refrigerator* (no bigger than 4.2 cubic feet)
- Small microwave*
- Coffee maker/Keurig (electrical appliances cannot have open faced heating coils)
- Microwaveable dishes
- Dishware/Flatware*
- Sealable food storage containers
- Can opener
- Reusable water bottles
- Water filter pitcher

What to Leave at Home

- Pets (Only fish in 10 gallon tanks or smaller are permitted)
- Kitchen appliances with open-faced heating coils (toasters, toaster ovens, crockpots, AIR-FRYERS)
- Candles, incense, space heaters, sun lamps, BBQ grills, fireworks etc.
- Weapons (guns, swords, stun guns, tasers, air guns, nunchucks, knives, etc.)
- Wireless computer routers
- Illegal Drugs and Drug Paraphernalia including prescription drugs not prescribed to you
- Alcohol, if you are under 21 years of age
- Expensive jewelry or large amounts of cash

Miscellaneous Useful Items

- Items of comfort, joy, and hobby (games, bicycle/lock, books, etc.)
- o Stationery, envelopes, stamps
- An open mind, spirit of adventure, and willingness to try new things!*
